# **Annual Meeting Notice**

**FALL 2017** 

### Saturday, November 18, 2017 Time: 1:00pm Blue Mountain Lake Clubhouse

The President will call the Annual Meeting to order and provide a brief report on the state of the Association. Since this year was an uncontested election, meaning there were less candidates than the total number of vacancies, there was no need for a formal vote by ballot and the election results will be decided by acclamation. These results will be announced and the new Board will be seated.

We will also be voting on new Bylaws, specifically the proposed Amended and Restated Bylaws that were mailed to all members. Since the Bylaws of the Blue Mountain Lake Club were written in 1993, there have been many changes not only within the Association but in the laws that govern Community Associations.

With that said, the BMLC Board of Directors, along with the BMLC Association's attorney have drafted an Amended & Restated set of Bylaws. Your vote to approve this amended and restated version will bring the Blue Mountain Lake Club Bylaws into compliance with current PA laws governing Community Associations and those of non-profit Pennsylvania corporations.

Further, doing so will ensure that the new Bylaws for BMLC reflect current practices that are clearly defined; correct inconsistencies and outdated provisions; as well as provide for operational improvements. For example:

- There are no longer different classes of voting membership.
- Definitions to Capitalized Terms have been added.
- Due to the 911 re-addressing project, the principal address of the Association has changed.
- Allow for Open Board of Directors meetings.
- Provide for no compensation to a member of the Board of Directors.
- Tightens the procedure for amending the Bylaws to reflect current best practices and standards.
- Election procedures are now included in the Bylaws rather than being established by resolution of the Board.
- Voting, Proxies, Balloting, Mail Balloting now comply with laws governing PA Non-Profit Corporation Law and are clearly defined.
- Member in Good Standing is now clearly defined.
- A provision was added that Management shall not have other contracts with BMLC (i.e. Landscaping and/or Snow Removal).

A Quorum, in person or by proxy, of at least 20% of members entitled to cast a vote (Members in Good Standing) is required to conduct business (VOTE) at the Annual Meeting.

If you are unable to attend the Annual Meeting to vote in person, *PLEASE fill out the Ballot/Proxy that was mailed to all members.* It can be used to cast your vote and will count toward quorum. Return to: The Blue Mountain Lake Club, c/o Pre-ferred Management Associates LLC, 121 Pocahontas Rd., East Stroudsburg, PA 18301. For your convenience, a postage paid return envelope was included in the mailing. We must receive your Ballot/Proxy no later than November 17, 2017.

The Board of Directors is grateful to have the opportunity to serve this wonderful community and we look forward to seeing you on November 18, 2017.

## **Outdoor Safety**

Many of us chose to live in Blue Mountain Lake because of its rural location. It may sound like a no-brainer, but living in the woods means sharing our space with wildlife, where encounters may be potentially hazardous. Awareness of surroundings and knowing what types of hazards exist is vital for your safety. Internet links for some are provided for reference.

There are a few basics regarding the outdoors, such as being able to identify poison ivy (https://www.facebook.com/NationwideChildrensHospital/ posts/10155538282170135), staying away from stinging insect nests (http://www. pestworld.org/news-hub/pest-articles/stinging-insects-101/), and knowing there is a chance of running into a bear, a snake (http://www.whatsnakeisthat.com/), or possibly a rabid critter like a raccoon (https://www.cdc.gov/rabiesandkids/ amy.htm). The Safety Committee suggests researching additional information on such hazards.

Even walking through the neighborhood or its paths warrants awareness. Dead branches may fall unexpectedly, so look up occasionally for them. Somebody backing a car or truck out of a driveway or turning a corner may not see you. Where possible, make eye contact with an approaching driver.

According to State Farm Insurance records for 2015-2016, Pennsylvania ranked 3rd in the US where drivers are likely to collide with a deer, causing injury to the driver and significant vehicle damage. Damage is also likely from striking a bear or turkey, or if a driver swerves to avoid hitting anything-including kids. Obeying a low speed limit gives drivers a better chance to circumvent an accident.

Despite the wet summer, top layers of leaves on the ground dry quickly and can ignite from a carelessly dropped cigarette. Brush fires in areas like the Poconos may not turn into the deadly wildfires we hear of in the Western US, but are nevertheless hazardous. Keep in mind the words of Smokey the Bear: "Only YOU can prevent forest fires."

Forest fires can, of course, be ignited by lightning. This, too, is a long shot in the Poconos, but does remind us of the dangers of being outdoors during a thunderstorm. In an area where "pop-up" storms happen, planning activities like hiking or boating should include how quickly one can get to shelter if necessary.

Finally, having a basic first aid kit handy can improve one's chances of keeping a minor injury from becoming worse. You are probably aware of these things, but it helps to revisit basics, and keeping them in mind should lend to making outdoor activity enjoyable.

Being a Lifeguard is a very important job. Please join me in thanking our 2017 Lifeguard Staff for a job very well done: Alex Trezza, Livia Marga, Olyvia Ulmer, Tyler Sweppenhiser, Jennifer Baez, Dina Welliver and Andrew Lopes.

- A Member's guest jumped in & hit her head on the side of the pool. When she didn't come back up, the Lifeguard on the nearest stand immediately sprang into action by jumping in, pulling her out of the water, and administering first aid.
- A 5-year-old, who was never around a large swimming pool, impulsively decided to jump into the 5-foot section without wearing any sort of floatation device. Since he didn't know how to swim and was flailing in the water, the Lifeguard nearest to him jumped in to save his life.
- An unsupervised 2-year-old who wasn't wearing a floatation device fell into one of the pools and one of our Lifeguards came to the rescue.
- Many children that couldn't swim, or who were uncomfortable in deeper water, found themselves in areas of the pools where they panicked & needed assistance either getting back into shallower water or out of the pool completely.
- Administering first aid was also a large part of the Lifeguards duties. There were many instances where Members or their Guests had cuts, scrapes, nosebleeds, or insect bites that needed attention.

I would also like to recognize our Pool Attendants, who worked hard at keeping the pool and pool area clean, organized and safe for everyone: Veronica Lukaszewski, Nina Morales, Nylah Safforld, Marta Kasica-Soltan, Michael Trezza and Latrell Barnes.




### **Common Area Rules**

All Common Areas of the Blue Mountain Lake Club are subject to private property laws.

- Common Areas of Blue Mountain Lake (i.e. Lake, Gazebo, Boat Launch, Clubhouse, Playgrounds, Mail Pod, Clubhouse, Basketball Courts, Tennis Courts, Recreational Field, Pools, Spray Park, and Walking Trails) are for use by BMLC Members in Good Standing and their guests.
- A valid BMLC I.D. badge is required at all times when using any common area. All guests must be accompanied by the BMLC Member when using the BMCL Common Areas.
- You must present your valid BMLC I.D. to security or management when requested.
- Should you fail to present your valid BMLC I.D. when requested, you will be asked to leave the premises. Should you fail to comply, local authorities may be contacted.
- Posted hours of operation for all BMLC Common areas must be followed.
- Music is prohibited on BMLC common areas (except for community events and/or private party rentals).
- Littering is prohibited and those that are caught will be subject to a fine per the BMLC Rules & Regulations.
- Abusive or threatening behavior towards management or security, by BMLC residents and/or their guests is prohibited and violators will be subject to a fine per the BMLC Rules and Regulations.

As a Member of The Blue Mountain Lake Club, you are obligated to abide by these predetermined Rules and Regulations as found in the Associations governing documents. Your cooperation is appreciated by your neighbors and ensures that Blue Mountain Lake continues to be a premier community in the Poconos.

Just a reminder that school is back in session. Please take a moment to review the following information and follow the link provided for additional information.

Safety should be the first and foremost on everyone's mind while driving during bus pickup and drop off times. If your schedule has you leaving or arriving in the community during school bus pickup and drop off, please allow yourself the extra few minutes that it will take to follow the Bus Stop Laws and keep the children, parents (and yourself) safe.

Please remember that passing a bus or doing anything aggressive near a bus with its flashing lights on is a violation of Commonwealth Law as well as BMLC Rules & Regulations. Ignorance of the law is not an acceptable alibi.

#### SCHOOL BUS SAFETY

School bus safety is a high priority in Pennsylvania. Students, parents, teachers, administrators, transportation personnel and the motoring public all play important roles in keeping our children safe while on or around the school bus.

#### SCHOOL BUS STOPPING LAW

- Motorists must stop at least 10 feet away from school buses that have their red lights flashing and stop arm extended.
- Motorists must stop when they are behind a bus, meeting the bus or approaching an intersection where the bus is stopped.
- Motorists following or traveling alongside a school bus must also stop until the red lights have stopped flashing, the stop arm is withdrawn and all children have reached safety.
- If physical barriers such as grassy medians, guide rails or concrete median barriers separate oncoming traffic from the bus, motorists in the opposing lanes may proceed without stopping.
- Do not proceed until all of the children have reached a place of safety.

On a final note, please be sure that as a parent and a student, you also show courtesy to the vehicles on the roadway. While waiting for the bus, please keep the roadway clear for vehicles to get by.

## Did You Know...

- Blue Mountain Lake Club Rules & Regulations #26: Passing a school bus, which is stopped to pick up or discharge children, is prohibited and carries a fine of \$300. This violation will also be reported to the local authorities.
- Blue Mountain Lake Club Rules & Regulations #27: All bus stop parking shall be in the designated parking area or as directed by BMLC Security. All vehicles shall be parked at least ten (10) feet behind bus stop signs and shall be parked on the same roadside. Failure to properly park or follow the directions of BMLC Security

and/or Management will result in a \$100 fine.

- Pets are not allowed at Bus Stops.
- BLMC Security will be on patrol during all school bus stop hours.


